



READ TO THE FINAL FOUR FAQS

1. Where do I log my school's reading minutes?

Upon registration, you will be provided with a link to log your reading minutes. Once you receive the link, you can reach out to support@helperhelper.com with any questions.

2. What is the competition reporting for Read to the Final Four?

Third grade students will read for an initial five-week period, where their minutes will be recorded in Helper Helper weekly, and then combined at the end of the period by class. After the first five weeks of competition, the Top 68 schools will compete to advance to the Top 32, Sweet Sixteen, Elite Eight® and Final Four, with the winning school having read the most minutes on average.

3. How are schools ranked against one another?

The schools will be ranked based on average minutes read by each student at their school to allow schools with smaller numbers of students to compete with larger schools. No school will ever be eliminated from the competition solely based on its size.

4. What happens if I forget to log reading minutes for a specific week?

If you forget to log minutes for that week, your school will not be eligible to be ranked for that prize period. However, still enter the minutes to have them count toward the overall competition.

5. What is the deadline to log minutes each week?

Minutes are due by Tuesday each week, no later than noon Central time.

6. Who can participate in the challenge?

Any registered third grade class within the city of Houston and surrounding areas.

7. When will the winner of the challenge be announced?

The top four schools will receive a VIP field trip to the Men's Final Four Fan Fest presented by Capital One at the George R. Brown Convention Center on Friday, March 31, 2023, where the winning school will be announced.
